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

Compendium on Acts and Rule

NOTIFICATION

No. 3857F., dated 15th August 1971.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor is pleased to make the following rules:

CHAPTER I—EXTENT OF APPLICATION

- These rules may be called the West Bengal Service Rules, Part I. Except where it is softened on the revise stated, they shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from the 1st October 1971.
- Subject to the provisions of the Constitution of India and except where it is otherwise
 apply search or implied, these rules apply to all members of services and holders of posts
 whose conditions of service the Government of West Bengal are competent to prescribe.

 Subject as aforesaid they also apply to—
 - (i) any person for whose appointment and conditions of employment special provision is made by or under any law for the time being in force;
 - (ii) any person in respect of whose service, pay and allowances or pension or any of them special provision has been made by an agreement made with him, in respect of any matter not covered by the provisions of such law or agreement.
- Note 1: The conditions of service of the subordinate ranks of the various police forces in West Bengal are determined by or under the Acts relating to those police forces respectively. Orders governing the application of these rules to the subordinate ranks of the police forces of West Bengal are issued by Government in the Home (Poole) Department.
- Bengal are issued by Government in the Home (Police) Department.

 Note 2: The position with relation to these rules of officers to whom Article 312 [and 314] of the Constitution of India apply is explained in the Preface.
- 3. The power of interpreting these rules is reserved to Government.
- Note 1: Whenever in these rules a power is ascribed to Government only, that power may not unless expressly provided by other rules, orders or notifications, be exercised except after consultation with the Finance Department.
- 3A. Nothing in these rules shall be Construed to limit or abridge the power of the Governor to dispense with or relax the requirement of any of these rules to such extent and subject to such conditions as he may consider necessary for dealing with a case in a just and equilable manner.
- a just and equitable manner.

 38. Notwithstanding arrything contained elsewhere in these rules or in any other rules for less than the time being in force, if a Government employee, being present at the place of his text

prescribed hours of work on any day, he shall, in addition to, being liable to such disciplinary action as may be taken against him for dereliction of duty, be deemed to be absent without leave for such day and shall not be entitled to draw any pay or allowances for such day?

3C. Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in these rules or in other rules for the time being in force:

(a) If any Government employee resorts to or in any way abets any form of strike for any period in connection with any matter pertaining to his service or the service of any other Government employee, be shall, in addition to being liable to such disciplinary action as may be taken against him in that connection, be deemed to be absent without leave during such period and shall not be entitled to draw any pay or allowance for that period.

(b)The authority empowered to grant leave may either commute retrospectively such period of absence without leave into extra-ordinary leave or may treat such period of absence without leave as amounting to a break in service entailing forfeiture of his previous service, and may base orders accordinally.

3D. Where under these rules any authority has been given power to issue any order, the exercise of that power shall be subject to such directions as Government may from time to time issue in this behalf².
4. Receal and Savings: All rules, orders or notifications corresponding to these rules in

force immediately before the commencement of these rules and applicable to Government employees to whom these rules apply are hereby repealed: Provided that in respect of anything done, any act committed or any omission made

NOTE.—Employees of Chandennagore Administration as have opted for the pre-merger conditions of service will be governed by the rules applicable to them before merger in respect of journeys within Chandemagore Municipality.

The power of interpreting these rules is reserved to Government.

NOTE.—Whenever in these rules a power is ascribed to Government only, that power may not, unless expressly provided by other rules, orders or notifications, be exercised except after consultation with the Finance Department.

A. Nothing in these rules shall be construed to limit or abridge the powers of the

Governor to dispense with or relax the requirements of any of these rules to such extent and subject to such conditions as he may consider necessary for dealing with the case in a just and equitable manner.

3B. All rules, orders or notifications which were in force immediately before the

ment of these rules and applicable to Government employees to whom these Rel

rules apply are hereby repealed;

CHAPTER II.—DEFINITIONS

 Unless there be something repugnant in the subject or context the following terms are used in these rules in the sense here explained:—

- (1) Actual travelling expenses means the actual cost of transporting a Government employee with his servants and personal luggage, including charges for ferry and other tolls and for carriage of camp equipment, if necessary. It does not include charges for hotels, travelers' burgalows or refreshments or for the carriage of stores or conveyance or the cost of telegraphic reservation of accommodation or conveyances or any allowance for such incidental losses or expenses as the breakage of crockery, wear and lear of furniture and the employment of additional servants.
- (2) Camp equipage means the apparatus for moving a camp
- (3) Camp equipment means tents and the requisites for pitching and furnishing them or, where tents are not carried such articles of camp furniture as it may be necessary, in the interests of the public service, for a Government employee to take with him on tour.
 (4) Omitted.
- (5) Controlling Officer means the authority declared by Government to be the controlling officer for the purposes of travelling allowance of a particular Government employee or class of Government employees.
- **NOTE.I Omitted.

NOTE 2.—The controlling officer for the purposes of travelling allowance for the journey of a Government employee to join his post under a borrowing Government as well as for the return journey will be the controlling officer in regard to his post under that Government.

**(5A) Competent authority in relation to the exercise of any power conferred by or under these rules, means the Governor or any authority to which such power is delegated by or under these rules.

(6) Darjeeling means the district of Darjeeling excluding the Siliguri subdivision. (6A) Dry and River District moans the district and the subdivisions or portions

(eA) bry and HIVEY DISTRICT moans the district and the subdivisions of pomons of the subdivision in it as may be specifically declared as "River" or "Dry" under the special orders of Covernment.

NOTE.—A list showing the existing classification of the districts and subdivisions into "Rivers" or "Dry" is given in Appendix 21.

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
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
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3. Flow of events leading to PSC Appointment process of a Teacher



Minutes of the TC meeting held on 22.03.2022 rence to CIR. No: 11/GGDCK/CIR-NOT/2022, dated 15.03.2022, the meeting of Teachers' Council of Government General Degree College, Keshiary was held on 22.03.2022 at 1:30 PM and following are the minutes of the discussion documented in the said meeting: Sri Inder Mukherjee (TCS) welcomed the TC and opened up the session with a formal invitation of The honoured members of the house raised a common concern about several infrastructural repair and proposal/observation on the college infrastructure. maintenance works that are causing discomfort and difficulty in day to day college activities. Sri Ashok Das raised the issue of renewal of contract of the existing three water purifier systems at the earliest. Dr. Sutapa Ray, Dept. of Chemistry, raised the issue of termite infested laboratories and class rooms which need immediate pest-management. She also informed the house about the decomposing wooden doors of her department due to termite infestation. Sri Sayantan Das, Md Ataur Rahaman, Sri Kalyanasis Bhattacharyya, Sri Soumya Sundar Mati, Alauddin Seikh, Miss Saranya Mukherjee and Smt Monua Panja raised the issue of repair and maintenance of the pipelines in the toilets of the teachers and students on urgent basis. They also identified that several window-panes have got broken and require replacement. Miss Saranya Mukherjee raised a remand to cover the windows of the class rooms of the 2nd floor with some tinted-materials to reduce the glaring effect of intense sunlight. Sri Inder Mukherjee also intimated the house about the malfunctioning of several electrical points and appliances in the college. He also informed the house that all the flood lights of the college has gone out of order and requires immediate attention to combat night time vigilance and security problems. He also raised the proposal for cleaning the college premises from weeds and unwanted overgrowths of plants. A list of repair and maintenance work submitted by Sri Debarshi Mondal before the house on behalf of the Infrastructure Committee which also included a demand for few lockers/almirahas from different departments iii. Dr. Sudipta Chakraborty (OIC) informed the house that the HED has been intimated with a complete repair and maintenance work proposal (from PWD, Electrical) along with a contract of annual maintenance in September and November, 2021. The higher authority is processing the proposal and an approval in this regard is expected in the next financial year (FY 2022-23). He also informed the house that the PWD (Civil) has been informed for an inspection of the repair and maintenance work in the college premises so that a proposal for the same may be moved to the HED at the earliest. PWD (Civil) has assured a visit by the month 2. Repair and maintenance work of existing computers and accessories: All the teachers of the house raised the issue of immediate repair and maintenance work needed for the existing computers, printers and computer accessories which has become non-functional due to lack of use during the long COVID-19 lockdown and college closure period since March, 2020. ii. OIC in consultation with the Financial Advisory Committee assured the house that the matter would be addressed with the aid of grants available in the coming FY (2022-23). 3. College sports (2022): Sri Inder Mukherjee raised the proposal of College sports (2022) in some favourable date after the completion of the Semester I University Examination, 2021. Sri Ashok Das opined that the intense heat in the current time is not favourable for major out-door sports event and proposed indoor -sports events as a possible alternative. Sri Sayantan Das concurred with the point of Ashok Das and Sri Soumya Sundar Mati proposed few events in this respect. The house unanimously supported the proposal and identified the 3rd week of April as a tentative time to organise the college sports, 2022 and the Sports Committee took up the matter to organise the event 4. College sweeping and cleanliness: i. Sri Ashok Das and Sri Kalyanasis Bhattacharyya informed the house that Smt Sakuntala Bera, the only parttime sweeper of the college has been working in the college since 2015 with a contract of Rs150/- per day for 10 days a month and that whether her contract may be increased to **20** days a month. The house unanimously supported the proposal and requested the OIC to take appropriate measure in this regard. The house univocally raised a demand for thorough cleaning and sanitization of the college buildings with any resource at the disposal of the OIC. The OIC assured the house of undertaking measures with some bona fide and experienced private agency at the earliest.

College popular talk series and book proposal: Sri Inder Mukherjee appreciated the endeavour of the popular talk series which is being conducted in the college since 2016 and called for new talk proposals from the teaching community of the house and other institutes for the year 2022. ii. Sri Soumya Sundar Mati and Smt Monua Panja brought forward one or more book (ISBN compatible) proposal based on the proceedings of the popular talk/lecture series of the college. iii. The house unanimously supported the proposal and the Seminar and Symposium Committee along with Sri Soumya Sundar Mati, Smt Monua Panja and Inder Mukherjee was provided with the responsibility to constitute the modus operands of the book proposal. 6. Service Book Update and CAS of the college teachers and UGC 12B proposal: i. OIC addressed the Service Book Committee to ensure thorough update of the Service Books of the teachers ii. He also addressed the house to complete the papers works associated with the due CAS proposals from the college with the support of the IOAC. iii. He also informed the house that the college would be taking up steps to submit UGC 12B recognition proposal at the earliest. 7. Proposal for research grant: OIC encouraged the teachers to submit respective research proposals to funding agencies like SERB, CSIR, DBT, WB-DBT, WB-DST, ICSSR, Asiatic Society etc. 8. Proposal to PWD(Roads) for upgrading the approach lanes to the college: i. OIC sought the opinion of the house on the proposal to request the Engineer, PWD (Roads) to make arrangement for upgrading the gravel approach lanes to the college with bitumen cover so that the same may be protected from the monsoon washout. ii. The house unanimously supported the proposal and requested the OIC to necessary measures in this regard. 9. Library functionality: i. Sri India Mukherjee raised a query on whether any librarian is going to join the college as the daily operation of the library has been largely affected in absence of any trained librarian. ii. OIC informed the house that no such information is available with him and the one librarian duly appointed by HED in GGDC, Keshiary has not reported with him till date. iii. Sri Soumya Sundar Mati raised the proposal of operations of the Library of the college with the aid of the Library committee and respective academic departments. The matter was discussed in the house and it was decided that the Library Committee will chalk out a way in consultation with the academic departments. 10. COVID-19 and emerging OMICRON infection: The emerging trend of COVID-19 and OMICRON in India and that in West Bengal was discussed in the house and it was unanimously resolved that the students would be regularly made aware of the recent trends of pandemic and they would be encouraged to follow appropriate COVID-19 protocol, both in college premises and social life. 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Minutes of the TC Meeting held on 05.04.2023

Reference to the Notification vide Circular No. 15/GGDCK/CIR-NOT/2023, Dated 30.03.2023, a TC meeting was held on 05.04.2023 at GGDC, Keshiary. The TC unanimously resolved on the following issues after thorough discussion as narrated below:

A. Emergency Plumbing Work:

- 1) Dr. Md Ataur Rahaman, Sri Ashok Das, Alauddin Seikh and others raised the issue of urgent repair work of several plumbing attachments which has resulted in hygiene problems in toilets of the college. Moreover, loss of water due to leakage was also reported.
- Some other plumbing issues were also reported by Dr. Monua Panja and Smt. Shila Baske.
- The TC unanimously resolved to address the plumbing issues on emergency basis as the intervention of PWD would necessitate fund approval and allotment which would be time taking. The TC requested the Officer in Charge, GGDC, Keshiary to take necessary measures by utilizing the college fund in this

B. Formation of a museum cum digital archive

- 1) Sri Inder Mukherjee raised the point of development of a digital library cum cine-lab cum smart room for archival and interactive sessions with relation to mainstream teaching-learning facility.
- 2) Sri Ashok Das, Dr. Soumya Sundar Mati, Alauddin Seikh, Dr. Sutapa Ray, Sri Debarshi Mondal, Sri Aritra Samajdar and Dr. Monua Panja supported the idea. Dr. Susanta Kumar Maity proposed the formation of such a facility in the space adjoining to the reading room of the library with necessary partitioning. He also proposed about the formation of a wall mounted museum to archive and display different aspects of cultural, ethnic and soci-economic importance with relation to the Keshiary block and its adjoining areas like grains and cereal profile, soil profile, plant and animal life profile, tools and instruments of anthropogenic importance, literary work, manuscript and archaeological artefact (if donated) etc. Such an archive was envisioned to draw appreciation from accreditation agencies and the proposal was
- 3) Sk Md Ismail Al Amin proposed that the said room may be supported with roof mounted LCD projector so that a smart room concept can be developed. He drew attention to the fact that a LAN network is already available in the said space.
- 4) Sri Sushovan Kar pointed that the library wall space may be decorated with relevant posters and murals that may create an environment appealing enough for the students for academia.
- The TC proposed that the said facility would be of great benefit for the college and its students and for greater public benefit the expense may be borne out of the college fund (fund from yesteryears selling of admission forms and student welfare fund). The TC requested the Officer in Charge, GGDC, Keshiary to take necessary measures in this regard.

C. Matter arising:

- 1) Sri Sushovan Kar put forward a requisition for a revolving journal/book display unit, few book trolleys for better manoeuvrability of books and 8 units of CC TV camera system for continuous surveillance in the library. The proposal was unanimously supported by the TC.
